50th anniversary of First Mass at Sacred Heart Church at Nelthorpe Street on 5 September '65

50 years at a glance:

'65: first Sunday mass on 5 September at Nelthorpe Street [decision in December '63 to build the new church; sod turned in October '64; construction started in November '64]; first Polish-language mass celebrated; construction on rectory started on 19 September;

'66: new rectory completed on 4 March; hymn singing, congregational participation and prayers in English at mass started on March 7; Bishop Remi de Roo dedicated new church on 26 June:

'67: 'red bag' collection started in March; parish became involved in Peace and Development; St. Vincent de Paul Society conference established on 17 July; first parish council elected on 5 November;

68: Cathechism program for public-school students started in the fall;

'70: Sacred Heart Parish School closed after 28 years; parishioners entered era of lay involvement in an expanded cathechetics program;

'71: first board of trustees formed to administer parish's finances and assets and handle maintenance of buildings and grounds; parish sold school and convent site to the diocese on 3 October;

'72: first Portuguese-language mass celebrated at the church on 2 May;

'73: lay people began distributing communion;

'76: girls cracked glass ceiling to become altar servers; first family mass on Sundays with focus on children participation; children baptized and welcomed by the community

during Sunday mass; pew collection for 'red bag' discontinued;

'77: parish became first depositor in diocese's Mutual Investment Credit [MIC] fund on 10 July; rectory's carport converted into Pope John XXIII meeting hall and chapel in December;

'78: first parish bazaar held 11-12 November to raise funds exclusively for charities [before, since its beginning in '36, the bazaar raised funds for the church and other uses; bazaar has evolved to now include: Spring Used Clothing and Attic Treasures Sale; ■ Fall Used Clothing and Attic Treasures Sale; ■ Fall Bazaar; and ■ Raffle during the Fall Bazaar]; parish began preparing in fall '78 to receive "boat people" — Vietnam refugees [helping refugees began with welcoming Hungarian refugees in '56; parish had a refugee committee from '82-'97 to help refugees];

'79: Tools for Peace in Nicaragua began in July and program lasted until '90;

'80: social justice committee established;

'84: Portuguese-language mass ended at Sacred Heart Church on 6 October when Our Lady of Fatima Church opened at Elk Lake Road; Fr. Peter Ho celebrated his first mass at Sacred Heart Church on 9 December after being ordained the day before — the first priest to do so after his ordination; first Vietnameselanguage mass celebrated and held until '94;

'85: Mary Walsh's annual bursary for high school and post secondary school students began from a \$30,000-donation [money also used in '85 to buy of copies of Glory and Praise hymn book for use by parishioners];

'86: Fr. Anthony Kwarta celebrated the 50th anniversary of his ordination at the church;

'87: parish leased part of its property to the diocese for the Pastoral Centre;

'91: parishioners became involved in Anawim House, a house for the poor, and the parish has been supportive ever since;

'98: parishioners began supporting the Lay Brothers of the Poor;

'00: bereavement ministry started;

'06: first Korean-language mass celebrated on 8 January; first Multicultural Celebration held in Iune:

'11: funeral reception committee established;

'12: Knights of Columbus Council #15445 established on 3 November;

'15: Parish's Catholic Women's League [Charter #939], established in '40, will observe its 75th anniversary on 24 November.

Did you know?

Parish Sunday bulletins in the '60s gave a detailed breakdown of the collection of the preceding Sunday.

For instance, on 12 September '65 [50 years ago]: "Two gave 50C; 15 gave \$1.00, 2 gave \$1.50, 33 gave \$2.00, 1 gave \$2.10; 1 gave \$2.25; 1 gave \$2.30, 2 gave \$2.50; 15 gave \$3.00, 1 gave \$3.50; 5 gave \$4.00; 32 gave \$5.00; 1 gave \$5.26; 2 gave \$6.00, 1 gave \$7.00; 1 gave \$8.00, 1 gave \$9.00, 7 gave \$10.00, 1 gave \$15.00, 2 gave \$20.00, 1 gave \$21.00; 1 gave \$25.00, 1 gave \$28, 2 gave \$50." The 131 parishioners gave a total of \$665.41, or an average of \$5.08.

In today's dollars term, this would be an average donation of \$38.27 for one Sunday's collection from 131 parishioners for a total of \$5,012.23!
