

We don't know the name of Peter's mother-in-law but I'm going to call her Hannah. This scripture used to irritate me; it almost seemed like Jesus healed Hannah just so she could serve the men who couldn't get their own lunch. As I got to know Jesus better, it occurred to me that Jesus doesn't just heal people; he anoints them and sends them. Whether they respond to his anointing is their choice but I believe every time Jesus heals someone, it's like throwing a rock into a pool. The ripples reach far. No touch of healing is ever wasted.

Hannah was anointed and healed but then she had the rare opportunity to listen to the Master as she served him. I believe every word resonated in the depths of her being and stirred her in a way she had never been stirred before. I believe she felt peace and a deep sense of her identity soaking into her. I believe she felt sent

That evening people came from all around to listen to and be healed by Jesus and I think Hannah was right there in the midst of the people, comforting and consoling, encouraging the shy ones forward, perhaps feeding the hungry. Those who were at the far edges of the crowd may have been downhearted, discouraged and frustrated but Hannah was there. She could move easily through the crowd because nobody was expecting her to help them. But I believe she did. She was kind and good. She touched people and blessed them. Many people were actually healed through Hannah's prayers but thought it was because they were in the proximity of Jesus.

Next morning, when Jesus was told everyone was looking for him, he felt free not to go back to the village and could head off to other villages to teach and heal. He was free because the people would not be abandoned. Hannah was there. Hannah would continue what he started.

As should we all.

Memorial of St. Paul Miki & Companions

Tuesday 6 February

Paul Miki, a Japanese Jesuit, and his twenty-five companions were martyred in Nagasaki, Japan. They were the first martyrs of Japan and East Asia to be canonized.

Paul Miki was born into a wealthy Japanese family and educated by the Jesuits in Azuchi and Takatsuki. He joined the Society of Jesus and became a well known and successful preacher. The ruler of Japan, Toyotomi Hideyoshi, began persecuting Catholics for fear of the Jesuits' influence, their intentions, and the intentions of the European visitors. Miki was arrested and jailed with his fellow Catholics, who were later forced to march 966 kilometers (600 miles) from Kyoto to Nagasaki; all the while singing the *Te Deum*.

Miki and his companions were pierced with lances while tied to crosses on 5th February 1597. They were killed simultaneously; crucified on a hill now known as the Holy Mountain overlooking Nagasaki. Their executioners were astounded upon seeing their joy at being associated with the Passion of Christ. Among them were priests, brothers and laymen, Franciscans, Jesuits, members of the Secular Franciscan Order, and catechists, doctors, simple artisans, servants, old men, and innocent children.

While hanging on the cross Paul Miki preached to the people gathered for the execution:

"The sentence of judgment says these men came to Japan from the Philippines, but I did not come from any other country. I am a true Japanese. The only reason for my being killed is that I have taught the doctrine of Christ. I certainly did teach the doctrine of Christ. I thank God it is for this reason I die. I believe that I am telling only the truth before I die. I know you believe me and I want to say to you all once again: Ask Christ to help you to become happy. I obey Christ. After Christ's example I forgive my persecutors. I do not hate them. I ask God to have pity on all, and I hope my blood will fall on my fellow men as a fruitful rain."

St. Paul Miki and his companions were beatified in 1627, and canonized in 1862.

Today, Nagasaki has the largest Catholic population in Japan.
