What Satan was trying to do with Jesus in the desert was set up a scenario where Jesus would be in competition with the Father. He

knew that once he got Jesus in that mindset, he would have won. He wanted to create a desire in Jesus to be in charge of himself and his destiny, a destiny that would include power and status but would exclude the cross.

From reading the bible, one could easily conclude that Jesus had no problem seeing through Satan's traps and immediately dismantling them. But the bible is a simple report, not a novel that endeavors to build tension and suspense. If Jesus had no trouble seeing what Satan was doing and immediately gave Satan what for, they would not have been called temptations. They were indeed tempting. Jesus had to pray and struggle to find his Father, grasp the truth and discover the power of scripture to move him beyond temptation. "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin." (Hebrews 4:15)

Not too many of us have been tempted to turn stones into bread, grab power over kingdoms or jump off high towers but we are always tempted to be in competition with God. We are constantly wanting to get a hold of a gnarly situation and bring it under our control. We often feel like everything is depending on us and if we're not directing the show, everything will go completely sideways. We can be very subtle with our control mechanisms so no one would call us control freaks but it needs to be said: we're not willing to let God be God, not willing to put all power and control into his hands, not willing to accept that nothing depends on us. God doesn't need us to accomplish what he wants to accomplish but he delights in allowing us to participate.

Control is not our strength.

It is our temptation.

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE

(Good Friday, April 18.)

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three disciplines of Lent.

Abstinence is observed from age 14 and older. Fasting is to be observed from age 18, and those who have not yet celebrated their 60th birthday.

The faithful and catechumens undertake these practices of penance seriously in preparation for baptism and the renewal of baptismal vows at Easter.

Fridays of Lent are compulsory days of abstinence. No meat is allowed. Catholics may substitute an act of charity in place of abstinence. However, some form of penitential discipline must be undertaken.

On a Fast Day one full meal is allowed. According to one's needs, two other meals may be taken. Together they should not add up to another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Plain water is allowed at any time.

When health or ability to work are seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt, consult the parish priest.





The Scriptural Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross originated in pilgrimage to Jerusalem and a desire to reproduce the Via Dolorosa. The earliest use of the word "stations of the cross" occurs in the narrative of an English pilgrim, William Wey, who visited the Holy Land in the mid-15th century and described pilgrims following the footsteps of Christ to Golgotha.

In 1686, in answer to their petition, Pope Innocent XI granted to the Franciscans the right to erect stations within their churches. In 1731, Pope Clement XII extended to all churches the right to have the stations, provided that a Franciscan father erected them, with the consent of the local bishop. At the same time the number of stations was fixed at fourteen. In 1857, the bishops of England were allowed to erect the stations by themselves, without the intervention of a Franciscan priest, and in 1862 this right was extended to bishops throughout the church.

Out of the fourteen traditional Stations of the Cross, only eight have a clear scriptural foundation. Station 4 appears out of order from scripture; Jesus's mother is present at the crucifixion but is only mentioned after Jesus is nailed to the cross and before he dies (between stations 11 and 12). The scriptures contain no accounts whatsoever of any woman wiping Jesus's face nor of Jesus falling as stated in Stations 3, 6, 7 and 9. Station 13 (Jesus's body being taken down off the cross and laid in the arms of his mother Mary) differs from the gospels' record, which states that Joseph of Arimathea took Jesus down from the cross and buried him.

To provide a version of this devotion more closely aligned with the biblical accounts, St. Pope John Paul II introduced the Scriptural

Way of the Cross on Good Friday 1991. The Stations are:

- 1. Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane;
- 2. Jesus is betrayed by Judas and arrested;
- 3. Jesus is condemned by the Sanhedrin;
- 4. Jesus is denied by Peter 3 times;
- 5. Jesus is judged by Pilate;
- 6. Jesus is scourged and crowned with thorns;
- 7. Jesus takes up his cross;
- 8. Jesus is helped by Simon of Cyrene to carry his cross;
- 9. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem;
- 10. Jesus is crucified;
- 11. Jesus promises his kingdom to the repentant thief;
- 12. Jesus entrusts Mary and John to each other;
- 13. Jesus dies on the cross; and
- 14. Jesus is laid in the tomb.

As noted in the Sunday Missal (Living with Christ, page 608), the Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship recommends that the traditional stations be revised to emphasize that the sufferings and redemption of Christ are one redemptive mystery.

In 2007, Pope Benedict XVI approved this set of stations for meditation and public celebration.
