

## \* 4th Sunday of Lent | 10th March 2024 \*



"And this is the judgement, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than the light because their deeds were evil."

Judgement is a neutral word but, whenever we hear it,

our minds immediately think 'condemnation'. Judgement simply means assessment and resolution. In the above words, Jesus's assessment was that the light had come but people were rejecting the light. The resolution was yet to come. To resolve something means to settle, sort out, solve, find a solution for, find an answer to, work out, straighten out, deal with, set right, rectify, iron out and reconcile.

Judgement, then, is a positive and beautiful process! Jesus told Nicodemus that he was not sent into the world to condemn it but to save it. His judgement or assessment was that there was an awful lot of darkness and evil deeds, including the dark states of heart and the less than holy deeds of the Jewish authorities, of which Nicodemus was one. But Jesus came to resolve this problem of evil and the resistance to coming into the light. His teachings were part of the resolution but the main event was the cross. The cross was his final Word that he did not come to condemn but to save.

Nicodemus was presumably a moral and upright man but Jesus did not preclude him from the necessity of salvation. Moral uprightness can be seen and measured but it is no substitute for the indwelling Spirit who comes and goes and cannot be pinned down and measured. What the indwelling Spirit does is draw people into the light so their deeds, if evil and destructive, can be resolved, rectified and reconciled. No one is condemned out of hand. That would just perpetuate the myth of a vengeful God. God's justice is restorative, not retributive.

Has it been a while since you have experienced metanoia and realized that your moral uprightness is not what will save you? Your upstanding reputation has little to do with your salvation. What has saved you and does save you is Jesus.

Hence the phrase, "The Good News".


