THIS WEEK IN THE PARISH

Robes Required

It always bothered me that the king in this parable singled out a guest with no wedding robe and had him bound and tossed out. The invited guests were not the wealthy patricians. What if this poor man simply couldn't afford a wedding robe? Where was the sin? I decided to do some deep research on ancient Jewish weddings.

At the time of this parable, the host of a wedding banquet provided all male guests with a white garment called a 'kittel' to wear into the banquet. It looked a little like a bathrobe and it had no pockets. The robe was white to signify unity with the bride, who wore white to signify purity. The robe had no pockets, which symbolized marrying for love, not for what material possessions could be gained through marriage. There was no excuse for a guest to enter a wedding banquet with no robe. It would have been obnoxious and rude. The guest in Christ's parable had been caught out; he was not there in unity with the bride but was there for whatever he could get. Perhaps he intended to stuff his pockets with food or with small valuables.

The bride of Christ is the whole body, the community with whom we celebrate the banquet of the Eucharist. Do we ever attend Mass (actually or virtually) with no thought of being in unity with the bride? Are we there for what we can get, not for what we can give and not so that we can be there in solidarity with our brothers and sisters everywhere?

This weekend is the weekend of the Thanksgiving banquet. In this pandemic time, our banquets will no doubt be very limited in size and there will be many who aren't able to participate in any community meal because of health concerns. While giving thanks for all you have got, spare some time, food or prayer for those who haven't got a banquet to attend.

Get your kittel on!
