“You are Simon, son of John.

You are to be called ‘Cephas’ which is translated Peter.”

‘Peter’, in turn, can be translated as ‘pebble’. When Jesus renamed Simon and called him Peter, I wonder if he was thinking of how he was going to take this insignificant pebble and eventually create a rock on which he would build his church. Of course, he was but Christ’s vision for Peter had nothing to do with Peter’s skills or gifts or holiness in that moment and Christ’s visions for us have nothing to do with how good we are, how socially attractive we are, how spiritually skilled we are or what our natural talents are. In that moment in this Gospel, it didn’t even have anything to do with Peter’s willingness or commitment; he hardly even knew who Jesus was at this time of renaming.

God is not limited by anything and he can create towering rocks out of little pebbles. There’s no doubt about it, Jesus knew that Peter was mostly going to be an irritating rock in his sandal during his ministry. Peter’s ego was, in turns, self-denigrating (“Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man,”) or a blustering blowhard (I will NEVER betray you, Lord!). He was not what we would call promising rock material. He was not who we would have chosen.

So, we must be very careful in our tendencies to judge another person according to what we see on the surface. We tend to value education, money and charisma when it comes to choosing people to lead but, you know, that seemingly insignificant person may be God’s choice to lead the bible study or manage a ministry. Did you ever ask him or her? Or does your glance always go to someone more prestigious, more full of charisma or overtly more spiritual? We need to be very careful.

Because we definitely would not have chosen Peter.



Feast of St. Anthony the Great Wed. 17 January



Known as "Father of Monks", and whose feast is also celebrated by the Eastern Orthodox Church, St. Anthony, also known as "Anthony of Egypt", "Anthony the Abbot", and "Anthony of the Desert", was born in Upper Egypt in 251 CE to a wealthy family. After the death of his parents, Anthony gave away his inheritance and became a hermit. Eventually, he gathered a group of ascetics together as a community; the

beginnings of what became known as Christian monasticism. His close friend and biographer was St. Athanasius, whom he helped against Arianism, a Christian heresy that declared that Jesus Christ was not truly divine.

St. Anthony the Great died on 17 January 356 CE.
