Why does the Church remind us of Jesus' apocalyptic prophesies every year? Perhaps Paul said it best in Hebrews 13: "For here we do not have a lasting city, but we are looking for the city that is to come." We are reminded that this is not our true home; our true home is yet to come.



We are especially called to remember this when there are major personal and social tribulations. No doubt, there were many who were wondering if the end was coming when the pandemic swept the globe. People would have wondered the same during World Wars I and II. They would have wondered during the Great Depression. They would have wondered during the Black Plague. They would definitely have wondered in 70 AD when, over a period of 8 months, the Temple (a construction that covered 450 acres!) was razed and there was a siege of Jerusalem. 1.1 million Jews died

My point is, we can't escape things like wars and rumors of wars and conspiracies or natural disasters. We can only try to evaluate whether we are trying to build ourselves an invulnerable kingdom here on earth by making sure we have what we personally need and building defenses against other people.

So, say some earth-shattering event occurs and we feel threatened and very insecure. What then? Hebrews continues: "Through Jesus, therefore, let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praise – the fruit of lips that openly profess his name. And do not forget to do good and to share with others for with such sacrifices God is pleased."

It doesn't seem like much. It doesn't sound like that will keep us safe. The issue isn't safety; the issue is focus. Will you focus on all that's wrong and frightening while striking out in anger and fear or will you focus on all that's right and light giving? Will you sacrifice your peace or will you offer a sacrifice of praise? Will you erect fences?

Or will you do good and share?




The Garry Oak and a number of other trees, will be cut down or pruned on **Tue, 19 Nov** from 7:15 am and may last the whole day.



## Presentation of the Blessed **Virgin Mary** November 21

The Memorial of Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the Temple recalls, according to the apocryphal gospels, the day on which Mary, while still a child, was brought to the temple in Jerusalem to be offered to God. The Church wants to emphasize not so much the historical event in itself, of which there is no trace in the Gospels, but the

total gift that Mary made of herself, by listening: "Blessed are those who hear the Word of God and observe it" (Lk. 11:28). This experience prepared the young girl from Nazareth to become the "temple of the Son of God".

The celebration of this feast dates back to the 6th century in the East with the dedication of the Basilica of Saint Mary the New built by the Emperor Justinian I near the ruins of the temple in Jerusalem. There is evidence that various monasteries in Italy celebrated the feast in the 9th century. It was not until the 15th century that it was included in the Roman Missal.

This is also the day on which the Church celebrates the World Day of Cloistered Life, established by Pope Pius XII in 1953.

In Scripture. Mary is the woman who knows how to listen, who knows how to contemplate, who knows how to refer everything to her Son: "Do whatever He tells you" (Jn. 2:5). Mary is the One who never abandoned her Son Jesus, not even along the way of the Cross. She "stood" under the Cross. She is a disciple who never abandons the Lord Jesus, who always "stands behind" Him. All of this can help us imitate the Virgin Mary. Every Christian is called to look at Mary, to learn from her, to entrust themselves to her intercession and to guard the "purity of the faith" against any idols that surround us.

### **The Memorare Prayer**

Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear and answer me. Amen.
