The Scandalous Circle

This week, the disciples showed they truly didn't get Jesus's message about worldly power and the Kingdom way. They had actually been engaged in rivalry about which of them was the greatest. One almost wants to be embarrassed for the disciple's obtuseness. We would NEVER have arguments like that, right?

Right?

Well, I think we generally are pretty good about not making overt statements about our own self-perceived successes and the status that comes from them but I'm not so sure about the kinds of comparisons that go on in our hearts. We really would love to be recognized as the best at whatever is important to us whether it's a skill, a ministry, a job, a prayer way or a project and it's hard when someone else gets the kudos or admiration or followers in an area where we are also putting in time and effort.

The one thing we don't always remember when Jesus speaks of being a servant or like a small child is that we need to find our worth in God alone as Jesus did.



Unless we know, know, know, how beloved we are by God, we will continually find ourselves in subtle rivalry with others. We will always be in comparison mode, finding ourselves either miserably lacking or offended that we are not as respected, admired and appreciated as we ought to be. We can hear Jesus's words about taking the lowest place and try to do that but soon we find ourselves needing more.

It's a never-ending circle of rivalry and stumbling blocks (skandalon) unless one steps out of the world and into God's heart where there is no rivalry, only love and complete acceptance. In the heart of God, we begin to know that all the stuff we thought was important isn't important at all. It doesn't matter if people don't respect us or admire us because we have everything our hearts need within the gaze of our loving God.

It's absolutely true: "Your love and your grace are enough for me."



SAINTS JOHN DE BRÉBEUF and ISAAC JOGUES, and Companions 26 September 2024

By 1632, the Jesuits had a mission center in Quebec, where they ministered to 20,000 Huron in 30 villages. The missionaries suffered from cold and heat and were not accustomed to the Huron culture. When the "black robes" arrived, Huron children ran to their mothers, afraid that they were sorcerers. The missionaries were blamed for a smallpox epidemic. Still, they tried to bring the faith to the native people, educate them, and teach them medical and agricultural skills. John de Brébeuf founded schools and wrote a catechism and dictionary in the Huron language. He was once condemned to death but spoke so well that he was spared. Noel Chabanel, a language professor, could barely stutter out Huron phrases. The food and life of the Huron repulsed him, but he vowed to stay. Rene Goupil and John de Lalande, lay missioners, worked without pay. Charles Garnier sometimes walked 40 miles to baptize one child.

The missionaries converted about two thousand converts in their many years in Quebec. Then the enemies of the Huron, the Iroquois, who resented the French, captured and tortured the missionaries. Rene Goupil was tomahawked while trying to baptize a baby. Anthony Daniel was at Mass when the Iroquois attacked, shot arrows at him, and threw him into the fire. Isaac Jogues was made a slave but escaped back to France. His left hand had been mutilated, but Pope Urban VIII allowed him to celebrate Mass, saying, "It would be a shame that a martyr of Christ not drink the blood of Christ." Isaac Jogues returned to America. On a peace mission to the Iroquois for the governor of New France, he was accused of bringing a bad harvest. The Iroquois thought his box of religious goods contained the plague. He was attacked and killed. The Indian who killed him was later baptized and took the name Isaac. The sufferings of the missionaries are the seeds of the Church.


As Tertullian, an early Christian writer wrote, "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church." The witness and martyrdom of Sts. Isaac Jogues, John de Brébeuf, and their companions was not fruitless. Ten years after their martyrdom, St. Kateri Tekakwitha was born. She was part of the Mohawk tribe that had killed these Jesuit missionaries.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL

27 September 2024

St. Vincent de Paul, born April 24, 1581, in Pouy, now Saint-Vincent-de -Paul, France, died September 27, 1660 in Paris. Canonized 1737. St. Vincent was the founder of the Congregation of the Mission (Lazarists or Vincentians) preaching missions to the peasantry and for educating and training a pastoral clergy. The patron saint of charitable societies, St. Vincent de Paul is primarily recognized for his



charity and compassion for the poor. He is also known for his reform of the clergy and in opposing Jansenism.

Educated by the Franciscans at Dax, France, he was ordained in 1600 and graduated from the University of Toulouse in 1604. He was allegedly captured at sea by Barbary pirates and sold as a slave but eventually escaped. He spent a year in Rome to continue his studies and then to Paris, where he remained permanently. He placed himself under the spiritual guidance of cardinal Pierre de Bérulle, who entrusted him with the parish of Clichy.

After founding the Congregation of the Mission in 1625, Vincent de Paul established in and around Paris the Confraternities of Charity, associations of laywomen who visited, fed, and nursed the sick poor. The wealth of these women, many of noble family, aided him in establishing the foundling and other hospitals. With St. Louise de Marillac he cofounded the Daughters of Charity (Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul) in 1633, patterned after the Confraternities of Charity, and was the first non-cloistered religious institute of women devoted to active charitable works.

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, dedicated to the service of the poor, was founded by Blessed Antoine Frédéric Ozanam in 1833.


