We're all aware that in Jesus's day, it was strongly believed that bad things

happened to sinful people, so if a tower fell on someone or another's blood was mingled with pagan sacrifices, it was because these people were sinners and deserved disaster. Jesus very clearly tried to abolish that notion. So why, even today, do some Christians believe that disasters occur because God is making a judgement on the people the disasters affect?

I heard recently that some people are saying that the fires in Los Angeles

happened because Los Angeles is full of sin and corruption. Guess what Jesus would say to that. He would say, "Do you think that these Los Angeles people were worse offenders than you? No, I tell you; but unless you repent you will all perish the same way."

What do we need to repent of? Making judgements about other people. By

making a judgement that others are being punished by God, we are setting ourselves up as better and we are saying that God is a violent and vengeful God. If God is violent and vengeful, that means we can be too, right? Even just saying someone deserved calamity because of sin is violence and vengefulness.

But wait...didn't Jesus say that if we don't repent, we will perish in the same way? Isn't that God's vengeance? No. It's human vengeance. The ones who suffered in the Gospel were judged by people to be sinful and deserving

calamity so if any of those making those judgements suffered calamity at some point, they too would be judged by others as sinful and deserving of calamity. Jesus is saying, "Stop judging! Stop the cycle of violence that you bring upon yourselves! Nobody is deserving of death or blessings but my Father is loving, merciful and compassionate. Be like him!"







Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord March 25

The Feast of the Annunciation, one of the principal feasts of the Christian church, is celebrated on March 25 (Lady Day), nine months before Christmas.

The first authentic allusions to the feast

(apart from the Gelasian and Gregorian sacramentaries, in both of which it is mentioned) are in acts of the Council of Toledo (656) and of the Trullan Council (692). Because its significance is much more than narrative, the Annunciation had a particularly important place in the arts and church decoration of the early Christian and medieval periods and in the devotional art of the Renaissance and Baroque.

The Annunciation, in Christianity, is the announcement by the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary that she is to conceive a son by the Holy Spirit, and he is to be named Jesus (Luke 1:26–38). The angel's pronouncement is met with Mary's willing consent ("Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word"), and thus precipitates the Incarnation of Christ and his redemption of the world.

The first mention of Mary is the story of the Annunciation, which reports that she was living in Nazareth and was betrothed to Joseph (Luke 1:26 ff.), and the last mention of her (Acts of the Apostles 1:14) includes her in the company of those who devoted themselves to prayer after the ascension of Jesus into heaven. She appears in the following incidents in the Gospels: the Annunciation; the Visitation with Elizabeth, her kinswoman and the mother of John the Baptist, the precursor of Jesus (Luke 1:39 ff.); the birth of Jesus and the presentation of him in the Temple (Luke 2:1 ff.); the coming of the Magi and the flight to Egypt (Matthew 2:1 ff.); the Passover visit to Jerusalem when Jesus was 12 years old (Luke 2:41 ff.); the marriage at Cana in Galilee, although her name is not used (John 2:1 ff.); the attempt to see Jesus while he was teaching (Mark 3:31 ff.); and the station at the cross, where, apparently widowed, she was entrusted to the disciple John (John 19:26 ff.).


