## **Maundy or Holy Thursday**



The word "Maundy" is originated from the Latin word "mandatum," which means "commandment." "A new commandment, I give to you," Jesus said: "to love one another as I have loved you." Dating back to the First Century AD, this is why English speaking countries call this day "Maundy Thursday" and why churches re-enact the foot washing Jesus performed at the Last Supper to demonstrate the importance of humility and spirit of selfless service.

The institution of the Holy Eucharist during the Last Supper, the Body and Blood of Christ through transubstantiation, is also celebrated today. Then, on the night of Holy Thursday, Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament takes place where the faithful remain in the presence of the Eucharist just as the Disciples kept a vigil with Christ.

Over the centuries, various traditions have also emerged, including the stripping of altars, and sharing of a special meal. In some cultures, Catholics spend the night of Holy Thursday visiting as many churches as they can in their diocese. Some parishes even extend the vigil overnight.

# Why?

A lot of Christians have an erroneous understanding as to why Jesus came to earth, did all that he did, and died horribly on the cross. That understanding is called Satisfaction Theory of Atonement (Penal Substitution): that Jesus had to die to appease God's wrath and to pay for our sinfulness. Let's just put that misunderstanding to rest, shall we?

That theory became mainstream around 1098 AD when St. Anselm of Canterbury wrote a book titled, "Cur Deus Homo" (Why God Became Man) to explain to his monks why Jesus died. He thought God would not forgive humanity unless our sins were paid for by the brutal death of his Son. Many think the Satisfaction Theory of Atonement is a doctrine of the Church but theologians were never bound to teaching this theory. In fact, here's what Pope Benedict XVI wrote about it:

"It is an unworthy concept of God to imagine a God who demands the slaughter of his son to pacify his wrath. God must not be thought of in this way. Such a concept of God has nothing to do with the idea of God to be found in the New Testament."

Theories abound as to why Jesus had to die but it is ultimately a sacred mystery. One tangible result of our Lord's death, as I've mentioned before, is that the meaning of sacrifice changed from 'a sacred, bloody and violent death to appease God and save ourselves, to a free will self-giving to save another. Another truth that arose out of the crucifixion is that we are called to love and forgive in the same way Christ died in total forgiveness. He forgave his crucifiers and he forgave his disciples. That was how he saved us. How can we not do the same? What is our excuse?

The realization of the beauty and critical impact of forgiving others from watching how Jesus died is metanoia. It is a conversion grace we cannot do without. As you go through Holy Week meditating on the love and forgiveness pouring from the cross, ask for this metanoia.

Your full Life depends on it.
