



Mountain Metanoia On the Mount of Transfiguration, Peter, James



On the Mount of Trans-John had conversion experience. Up until that event they had upended their lives to follow Jesus and believed that he was Messiah. Thev spoke with him, listened to his teachings and witnessed miracles of healing and deliverance but up on the mountain their perceptions were shifted and their minds were changed based on

new information – in other words, they experienced metanoia.

From where we stand, we know that they didn't receive complete understanding of who Jesus was. They had no idea that Jesus would be crucified and rise from the dead and they spent their journey down the mountain trying to get their heads around what rising from the dead meant. They weren't successful because they still had more conversions and more metanoia to experience. But the experience of seeing Jesus with Moses and Elijah and hearing God's voice in the cloud took them from one level of knowing Jesus to a whole different way of perceiving him. Another piece of the puzzle was put in place.

We can never say, "Been there. Done that. Don't need to go any further." We will never have a complete picture until we go Home and any images and understandings we have of Jesus and the spiritual life will always be incomplete. There are more mountains to climb with Jesus and more moments of revelation where more scales fall from our eyes. But we can choose to stay where we are with the way things have always been for us; God does not force metanoia upon us.

Where were the rest of the disciples in the Transfiguration story? Did they decline to climb the mountain? Were they too tired? Did they love Jesus a lot but weren't looking for anything more or different than what was already happening so said, "Nah. You guys can go. We'll wait down here. Anyway, he probably just wants to pray like he always does. Same old, same old." Whatever their reasons for staying at the bottom, they missed metanoia. They missed a crucial shift.

Just like we will if we decline the climb.

- 2. Repentance and remorse for one's sins: arising from faith and love of God.
- 3. Firmly resolve not to sin, or repeat a sin again.
- . Confess and disclose the sins to a priest.
- Fully intend to make reparation, and do works of reparation for the sins.

- 11. Have I been faithful to Sacramental living?
- 12. Have I helped my parish grow holier and stronger?
- 13. Have I abstained and fasted on obligatory days?
- 14. Have I been mindful of the poor?

1. **Pride**: am I self-centered?

- 2. **Greed**: are money and things my real goals in life?
- 3. Lust: am I pure in act, speech, and thinking?
- 4. **Anger**: do I control my temper and tongue?
- 5. Gluttony: do I control my appetites and addictions?
- 6. **Envy**: am I jealous of what others have or are?
- 7. Laziness: am I lazy? Am I apathetic?

Sorrowful Mystery Meditation One Mystery at a Time 2.30pm Lenten Fridays


