

St. Simon (the Zealot) & St. Jude (Thaddeus) 28 October

Sts. Simon and Jude were Apostles of the Lord Jesus Christ.

After many years of evangelizing after Jesus' Resurrection, these men are said to have suffered martyrdom together after having gone as missionaries to Suanis, a city of Persia. Because of this, they are honoured on the same day.

St. Simon is referred to in Scripture by Matthew and Mark as the "Cananaean" and by Luke as "the Zealot." Both titles mean the same, zealous for the Jewish Law, and distinguish him from the Simon whom the Lord renamed Peter, or Rock. It is unclear whether he belonged to the political party of that day, which was known as the Zealots, or was simply known for his religious zeal.

St. Jude is one of two Apostles with this name. The other, usually called Judas, is the infamous Judas Iscariot, known for his betrayal of Jesus. Here we refer to Jude Thaddeus, the saint increasingly popular as the patron of hopeless causes. He is also the author of the New Testament book the Epistle of Jude.

Not much is known about the lives of Simon and Jude from the Gospels. Even so, God chose these men, granted them holiness, worked through them in the lives of many in their own time, and continues to work through them today.

St. Simon the Zealot is the patron saint of saw workers and tanners. This derives from one account of his martyrdom in which his hands were sawed off.

St. Jude is popularly known for being the patron saint of impossible causes.

Redefining Justification by Jean Allen

Have you ever noticed how human selfjustification is built on exclusion?

In the parable of the Pharisee and the Publican, the Pharisee compares himself to the Publican and expects that God will accept his righteousness over that of a person he deems outside the circle of

righteousness. The publican is not considered part of the acceptable circle; therefore, he is excluded, not only from God's mercy but also from the Pharisee's respect.

The parable is one that we read and make little mental judgements of the Pharisee. We think, "What an arrogant so and so. How can anybody be like that?" But it never occurs to us that we may be exactly like that and that we have acceptable religious circles that others are outside of just because they act and believe differently from us.

"Two people went up to the church to pray, one a 'liberal' Catholic and the other a 'conservative' Catholic. Both said, "God, I thank you that I am not like this other person here." "I kneel and receive on the tongue." or "I receive on the hand, standing up." "I kneel in the pew after I receive." or "I stand after I receive." "I respect the Body of Christ with reverence and silence." or "I welcome the Body of Christ with hugs and conversation."

Nobody went away justified.

Justification here means being a person God is able to bless because the heart is not all wrapped up in self-justification. There's not much God is able to do with someone who thinks all the right actions makes them acceptable and fully believes that God is totally on their wavelength. We are all going to be so surprised when we finally meet God face to face and find out that we didn't have a clue about his love and that our circles of inclusion and exclusion were more like little prisons that didn't keep us holy but kept us self-centric.

There's a whole lot more to "Love your neighbor" than we thought.


